RE: FY17-31 Projected Enrollment Update

Recently, McKibben Demographic Associates issued revised enrollment projections for FY 2016/17 – 2030/31. These projections update the estimates developed in March, 2015 for a fifteen year period.

The updated results, which are depicted in the chart below, indicate the following broad findings:

- Steady enrollment District-wide, with only a slight decline through FY 2030/31. The projected Pre-K-12 enrollment of 5,437 in FY31 is only 146 pupils less than the current Pre-K-12 enrollment of 5,583, a reduction of only 2.6% overall. On an annual basis, the average annual change is projected to be a loss of 10 pupils, or -0.2%/year.
- Elementary enrollment will begin to decline steadily after 2019, as a result of the Town's declining birth rate (of 1.79, versus the replacement level of 2.1) and amount of net in-migration rate, which is insufficient to offset the declining birth rate. Most out-migration will continue to occur in the 18-24 and 70+ age groups, as young adults leave Needham to attend college or move to urbanized areas and empty nesters downsize their residences. Most in-migration will continue to consist of younger adults and their children in the 0-9 and 30-44 age groups, moving to Town largely from areas within 100 miles of Needham.
- Changes in the year-to-year enrollment will continue to be due to smaller cohorts entering and moving through the system, in conjunction with larger cohorts leaving the system.
- Even if the District continues to have a modest level of new home construction, the rate, magnitude and price of existing home sales will become the increasingly dominant factor affecting population and enrollment change in the future.

The revised projections represent a moderate increase over the previous estimates, however. As evident from the table below, which compares the revised (November) projections to the prior (March) projections, McKibben is projecting an increase in both the elementary and middle school populations (of 183 and 102 students, respectively, by FY 2029/30), which will ripple through the system and result in a larger population of High School students (by 80 students in FY 2029/30.)

As described by McKibben, the additional elementary students reflect an uptick in existing home sales between July 2014-July 2015, for all districts except Broadmeadow. In addition, the November 2015 projections incorporate potential additional students resulting from the Glendale Mews and Needham Crossing projects, of 50+ and 25+ students by 2024, respectively. (The Mews project is located in the Broadmeadow district and the Needham Crossing project is situated in the Eliot district.) In addition, the revised projections reflect a slight uptick in the rental occupancy rate, which predominately influences the Hillside district enrollment. Finally, the middle school estimates reflect some uptick in the number of children coming from private schools and an increase in the retention rate for the Pollard school.

The attached charts include both the revised November 2015 projections, and a graphical depiction of enrollment by school, with a comparison to the prior (March 2015) projections.
